Carmen de Ayora, on the border between Valencia and Aragon, steeped in the era of the eighties at IVAM and assistant to Emilio Martínez. Her work is important, resilient and willingly unknown, and she has accompanied several generations of artists in drawing, painting and feminism. Her friends who accompany her 'make a living'. When she arrived in Barcelona 25 years ago, she met Francesc Ruiz and Amanda Cuesta, who were making Creatures with Maribel López and Glòria Pou. She set up a resistance group in a workshop in the Raval called Baladre and tried to question almost everything, produce beauty and have a good time: they made their own exhibitions and selfconsumption performances. Other slightly more public ones were in Santa Coloma, Bendito defecto (Blessed Defect, 2001), in Logroño, Las muy ricas horas de Carmen de Ayora (The Really Rich Hours of Carmen de Ayora, 2005) and, in the first Galería Alegría, Las emociones reservadas, presentación del tremendismo (Reserved Emotions, Presentation of Dark Realism, 2011). Always in the front row of the group Perlita (Anabel, Iñigo, Jesus, Raimon), to which she contributes her drawings for the band's image. Working and drawing group with Toni Crabb and Sinead Spellman, with a show at etHALL, The Drawing Game (2013). Friend of the Halfhousero circle, where she exhibited Tiempo libre (Spare Time, 2015). Artist and lover of La Escocesa, partner of Idoia Monton and Toni Hervás, with whom she maintains a close relationship of mutual development. And especially of the project Dibujo Libre, with students at the Cintra school in the Raval since 1996, managing to disobey the mandates of the school institution with her methodologies and escape from the neighbourhood's art institution trend.
